Hugs for Home Visitors

Families who have a home visitor from the Parents As Teachers and Healthy Families America programs will probably agree these staff are pretty special people. Honoring Elsie

Thinking of home visitors who are special, we share the sad news of Elise Diduch's death on February 24th after a long battle with cancer. Most recently, Elsie was the program director for the Parents As Teachers home visiting services at the Union City Family Support Center. She has a long, strong history of advocating for children and families in Erie County, and around the world. A tireless worker, Elsie was involved in the development of many local preschool and early learning initiatives, and was especially devoted to working with kinship caregivers. Many in the Erie Community knew and worked with Elsie, admiring her passion and longstanding commitment to quality early education. To continue Elsie's legacy of supporting children, the Erie Community Foundation has created a special division of Erie's Future Fund to support a certain number of scholarships to be called "Elsie's Kids", given annually to children living with families with low income in Erie County.

Winter Feature Keeping a Baby Warm and Safe on Cold Winter Nights

Extra blankets can seem so cozy in a baby's crib but soft bedding can block a baby's airway during sleep. A firm mattress covered with a tightfitting crib sheet is all you need for your baby to sleep well. If you are worried about keeping your baby warm on those cold winter nights, try using a sleepsack (wearable blanket).

- Because most infant suffocation occurs in the sleeping environment, babies should always sleep in a safe crib, bassinet or pack-n-play.
- Lay your baby on his or her back for every sleep.
- We know that stuffed animals, bumpers and all those cute accessories make a baby's crib seem warm and cozy. Unfortunately, they can often do more harm than good. Soft bedding can block a baby's airway during sleep. A firm mattress covered with a tight-fitting crib sheet is all you need to make your baby sleep like a baby.

- Room-sharing is a safer option than having your baby sleep in bed with you. Place your baby's crib, play yard or bassinet in your room for more convenient feeding and close contact.
- Remember to always return your baby to his or her own crib when you are ready to go back to sleep. This is tough sometimes because parents are often more tired than the babies, but it is much safer.

Need Assistance Paying for Child Care?

Child Care Information Services of Erie County May be able to Help

CCIS, the subsidized child care program helps low-income families with the cost of child care

Basic Guidelines:

- You must live in Pennsylvania
- · Meet Income Guidelines for your family size
- Work 20 hours or more a week or— work 10 hours and in a school/training program for 10 hours a week
- · Have a promise of a job that will start in 30 days
- · Have a child that needs care while you work or attend an education program
- Child eligible from birth -12 years of age.
- · Teen parents enrolled in a full time education program

No "Waiting List"

- Currently CCIS of Erie County does not have a waiting list for low income subsidized child care funding.
- Applications can be made by phone or online line at Compass.

Income Guidelines

The Annual income for a family to be eligible to receive child care subsidy is 200% of the Federal Poverty Income Guidelines

Family Size	Maximum Yearly Income (May 2013)
2	\$31,020
3	\$39,060
4	\$47,100
5	\$55,140
6	\$63,180



- Use quality child care for before and/or after school care for school aged children.
- Summer care only applications being accepted April 1
- Not sure what child care providers may offer before/after school care or care for your younger children feel free to call CCIS Resource and Referral for a listing of regulated providers call 451-6676.

Enrollment for health insurance open only until March 31, 2014!

Find out if you can access affordable health insurance at <u>Healthcare.gov</u>

- Individuals and families in Erie County have several options for obtaining assistance in finding and applying for health insurance through the <u>healthcare.gov</u> website.
- Community Health Net has five Certified Application Counselors who are available to assist consumers with this process.
- The Certified Application Counselors at Community Health Net are available 7 days a week to go into the Erie County community upon request to assist individuals in navigating the healthcare website. Sessions have already been conducted at the library, churches and social service agencies.
- Open Enrollment is available through March 31 to select a health insurance plan through <u>Healthcare.gov</u> for the year 2014. If you do not currently have health insurance and you enroll during this open enrollment period, you will not be subject to the fee for not having insurance. Most people must have health coverage in 2014 or pay the fee.
