Erie Team Joins National Home Visiting Research Collaborative



Erie Family Center staff recently traveled to Washington, DC to participate in the first Learning Session of a national research collaborative, the Home Visiting Collaborative Improvement and Innovation Network (HV CollN.)

One of three Home Visiting providers in PA invited to participate, the EFC team will focus Quality Improvement strategies to improve outcomes for mothers screening positive with

symptoms of Maternal Depression. Baseline data was collected in advance and displayed on a storyboard shared with other participants, including 11 state MIECHV leaders, 37 implementing agencies, and 2 tribal nations. Eight Evidence-Based Home Visiting models are represented among the participants, including many who implement multiple models as we do in Erie. Faculty consultants from John Hopkins, Brigham and Women's Hospital, Erikson Institute, MIT, U.S. Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA), and the Education Development Center, will guide participating agencies through the learning process over the next 18 months.

A Learning Collaborative is a method of improvement to extend and adapt existing knowledge, adjusting practice as needed to achieve a common goal. The Home Visiting CollN will benefit the home visiting field by:

- Disseminating practices known to work
- Encouraging innovation
- Building leadership for Quality Improvements
- Promoting sustainability, and
- Demonstrating effectiveness of home visiting in large scale implementation.

Encouragement to develop highly innovative practices is common to the Learning Collaborative experience. The Erie team looks forward to "Thinking the Unthinkable" as we continue our involvement in this action-packed, data-driven collaborative.

Systematic Training for Effective Parenting

Systematic Training for Effective Parenting (STEP) is a "classic" parent education program that has been taught in many communities since the early '80s. The strength of the program is the group experience for parents in which the values of democratic child-rearing are promoted The topics focus on positive discipline techniques that encourage respect and equality in the communications among all family members.

Because children behave and develop differently at different ages, STEP offers three course options including Early Childhood STEP for parents of children under age 6, STEP for parents of school-age children, and STEP Teen for parents with children in their tweens and teens.

Feature on Pennsylvania Yellow Dot Program

During a recent visit with State Representative Curt Sonney, we discovered the Pennsylvania Yellow Dot Program. We thought this would be especially helpful for families with small children, especially those with special needs. We pursued the Yellow Dot Program, and now have a stack of Yellow Dot program kits and instructions available for all interested families. Learn more about the Yellow Dot Program below, and make sure to ask your home visitor or caseworker for a Yellow Dot program kit today!



About the Yellow Dot Program

Pennsylvania's Yellow Dot Program was created to assist citizens in the "golden hour" of emergency care following a traffic crash when they may not be able to communicate themselves. Placing a yellow dot in your vehicle's rear window alerts first responders to check your glove compartment for vital information to ensure that you receive the critical medical attention you need.

The program is a cooperative effort among the Pennsylvania Departments of Transportation, Health and Aging; the Pennsylvania State Police; the Pennsylvania Turnpike Commission; and first responders and local law enforcement.

How The Program Works

Participants complete a personal information form, which includes the participant's name, contact information, emergency contact information, medical history and medications, allergies and the participant's doctors' contact information. A photo – showing only the participant's head and shoulders – is then taped to the front of the completed information sheet.

The yellow dot decal provided in the program kit is placed in the lower left corner of the vehicle's rear window. The top of the sticker should be no higher than 3.5 inches from the bottom of the window. This decal alerts first responders that vital information can be found in the vehicle.

Place the completed information sheet, with the attached picture, into the Yellow Dot folder, and then place the folder into the vehicle's dashboard glove compartment.

How to Use Yellow Dot

- Fill out the medical information sheet, with one sheet per person participating in the program. If any of your information exceeds the space provided on the sheet, you may attach a separate sheet with the applicable information to the sheet.
- Affix a current photo of the participant's head and shoulders (approximately 3 inches by 3 inches in size) to the front of the information sheet. If a photo is not available, the sheet should still be included in the folder so the medical information is available.
- Place the Yellow Dot program folder with completed medical information sheets inside your vehicle's dashboard glove compartment.
- Place the yellow sticker on the inside of the vehicle's rear window. When facing the rear of the vehicle, the sticker should be placed in the lower left section of the rear window. The top of the sticker should be no higher than 3.5 inches from the bottom of the window. The sticker will not affect the rear defroster's operation.
- If necessary, the sticker can be attached no higher than 3.5 inches from the bottom of the vehicle's rear side windows.
