#### **Before Teaching**

 Read the Big Ideas and Key Understandings and the Synopsis. Please do **not** read this to the students. This is a description for teachers, about the big ideas and key understanding that students should take away **after** completing this task.
<u>Big Ideas and Key Understandings</u>

Culture shape our values and beliefs.

#### **Synopsis**

In this autobiography, students will see how one person's memories of growing up in a close-knit community bring joy and pride. The author also tells about her childhood fascination with horned toads, about the cactus pads the family would eat in the winter and spring, about family gatherings where empanadas were served, and about birthday and Easter celebrations. Garza shares with great pride her Mexican heritage along with the dances the community would have at the neighborhood restaurant. Collections - 2001

- 2. Read entire main selection text, keeping in mind the Big Ideas and Key Understandings.
- 3. Re-read the main selection text while noting the stopping points for the Text Dependent Questions and teaching Vocabulary.

### **During Teaching**

- 1. Students read the entire main selection text independently.
- 2. Teacher reads the main selection text aloud with students following along. (Depending on how complex the text is and the amount of support needed by students, the teacher may choose to reverse the order of steps 1 and 2.)
- 3. Students and teacher re-read the text while stopping to respond to and discuss the questions and returning to the text. A variety of methods can be used to structure the reading and discussion (i.e.: whole class discussion, think-pair-share, independent written response, group work, etc.)

- Re-Read, Think, Discuss, Write
  - In the autobiography *In My Family* author and illustrator Carmen Lomas Graza shares information about her Mexican American culture through her words and her paintings. Re-read page 510. How does Carmen's Mexican American culture influence her childhood growing up in Kingsville Texas and later as an adult, author illustrator? Answer: As an adult, each time Carmen paints her purpose is to bring about pride in the Mexican American culture. Influenced by her childhood her autobiography tells of events that has shaped her life as an author. Her story shares a part of that culture growing up in Kingsville Texas: cleaning and eating nopolitos, making empanadas and sharing them with family members, hitting a piñata at her birthday, the Easter egg, and the dances at the El Jardin.
  - 2. Write a short essay comparing your childhood to that of Carmen's? What traditions does your family have that have influenced you?
