## Course Description

Algebra 1 is the first course of college-prep mathematics (followed by Geometry, Algebra 2, Trigonometry/Precalculus, AP Calculus) and is tested in the Keystones. Taking the Algebra Keystones is required by ALL students enrolled in Algebra 1. Passing this course /Keystone test is one of the more direct ways to graduate on time and it is my plan to work with you this year to make that happen!
