The Horticulture/Landscape Management program gives students the technical knowledge and practical skills needed to produce, process and market plants, shrubs and trees for outdoor landscaping and interior plant scaping.

Students learn practical skills, including lawn and garden care, small-engine maintenance and repair, and use of power tools and heavy equipment. They also explore botany, soil science, sustainable horticulture, and horticultural business operations.

Successful students will be prepared for entry-level jobs in the horticulture/landscaping industry or prepared for post-secondary programs.
