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RECOVERY STUDENT

Strong independent work habits, personal commitment, strong parent support, along with participation, are expected for success. To qualify for entry into the School District of the City of Erie Accelerated Learning Academy, the prospective student must:

- Attend in person daily
- Be a member of the current 11th or 12th-grade cohort, but short the credits necessary to graduate on time
- Possess basic computer skills and a working knowledge of the internet
- Work on your subjects and projects outside of school
- Accept all rules associated with the Accelerated Learning Academy, in addition to the EPS Student Handbook
- Sign a School District of the City of Erie Accelerated Learning Academy Application and Code of Conduct

ATTENDANCE RULES AND PROGRESS REQUIREMENTS

Excellent attendance is a non-negotiable expectation of the Accelerated Learning Academy. Students will be assigned to either a morning (8:00 am – 11:00 am) or an afternoon (12:00 noon – 3:00 pm) session and will be expected to attend every day school is in session.

- 1. The Accelerated Learning Academy (ALA) follows the regular attendance policy of the Erie School District. Any absence will require an excuse, or it will be considered an illegal or unexcused absence.
- 2. Students still of compulsory attendance age who acquire illegal absences will be subject to notices and fines.
- 3. Students beyond compulsory attendance age will be removed from the rolls upon recording ten (10) consecutive absences.
- 4. Academic Progress/Credits: Students must maintain a minimum passing grade of 65% in all courses. Partial credit will not be given for incomplete courses. High school students are required to complete a minimum of two (2) full credit classes per quarter for a total of eight (8) credits per year. Course completion requirements will be based on the number of credits a prospective student has earned prior to enrollment in the ALA.
- 5. Students who are behind in credits will be expected to increase their rate of class completion in order to graduate with their cohort group or in as timely a fashion as is practical. Academic progress will be monitored weekly, and progress reports sent via email will be available upon request. Students are required to adhere to each online course's academic expectations and to follow the individual academic progress plan established by the District.

ACADEMIC DISHONESTY

Students caught cheating will be removed from the course and will receive a failing grade. Definitions for the term 'cheating' can be found in the Student Handbook. Students removed from a course for cheating will also be removed from the program permanently.

STUDENT/PARENT RESPONSIBILITIES

Online course work is rigorous. In order to recoup lost credits, students must put forth their best effort and are expected to manage their time appropriately in class. If a student is in need of academic support, it is recommended that they remain at school to work in the cyber lab. The lab is open from 8:00 am to 2:30 pm each day school is in session.

- Students will have access to the online course at all times. Additional course work can also be completed via Internet access at home, at a public library, or anywhere a student can access a Wi-Fi connection to log on to the internet.
- Students will meet three times a quarter with a teacher to set and review goals for course completion and credit recoupment.
- Students are required to abide by all School District of the City of Erie rules regarding behavior, attendance, and academics.
- Students are required to take the Keystone exams and other required exams at PJD Success Center @ Emerson Gridley.
