STUDENT/PARENT RESPONSIBILITIES

On-line course work is rigorous. The district requires that parents/guardians regularly monitor their children's daily attendance and online coursework progress. Problems should be reported to school officials promptly.

- ➤ If a student is in need of academic support it is recommended that they report to school to work with teachers in the cyber lab at the assigned time. Students in grade 6-12 have the opportunity to attend Emerson-Gridley in our cyber lab. The cyber lab is open daily from 8:00am 2:30 pm. Students that do not meet the required hours or are failing will be required to attend at least two (2) days of Cyber Lab
- Parents and students are required to seek assistance promptly for technology problems. If you experience issues relating to software (online program/programs) or hardware (the computer), you are to notify the Cyber Program teacher immediately. Alternately, you may attempt to obtain assistance via the number that was provided at orientation. Please note that technology issues are not necessarily eligible to be cited as an excused absence. Courses can be accessed from any computer that can access the Internet through a Wi-Fi connection, including but not limited to home Wi-Fi, public Wi-Fi, and LTE.
- > Students are required to abide by all School District rules regarding behavior, attendance and academics.
- > Students are required to take the Keystone exams and other required tests at a School District of the City of Erie site
- Parents are responsible for transportation of their children to and from the cyber lab
- ➤ Log on for a minimum of twenty-five (25) hours per week
- Complete a minimum100 assignments weekly
- Once exiting the Cyber Program all equipment that was issued must be returned within one (1) week, after this time the student and/or that student's parent/guardian will be responsible for any and all cost billed to the district associated with the computer that was assigned.

ACADEMIC DISHONESTY

Students caught cheating will be removed from the course and will receive a failing grade. Definitions for the term 'cheating' can be found in the Student Handbook. Students removed from a course for cheating will also be removed from the program permanently.

ATTENDANCE RULES AND PROGRESS REQUIREMENTS

Excellent attendance is a non-negotiable expectation of the Online Campus Program. Because attendance expectations and record keeping methods in non-traditional, at-home cyber courses are unique, special attendance rules have been established..

- Attendance requirements: Students must log in and actively participate in coursework <u>a minimum of twenty-five (25) hours</u> each
 week to avoid truancy Absences for which no proper written excuse if received will be considered an illegal or unexcused absence
 and thereby subject to truancy policies and laws. Excuses may be sent to the cyber teachers electronically. For your protection, it is
 advisable that you request receipt emails for electronically submitted excuses and that you maintain your records diligently.
- 2. Students still of compulsory attendance age who acquire illegal absences will be subject to notices and fines.
- 3. Students beyond compulsory attendance age will be removed from the rolls upon recording ten (10) consecutive absences.
- 4. Academic Progress/Credits: Students must maintain a minimum passing grade of 65% in all courses. Partial credit will ot be given for incomplete courses. High school students are required to complete a minimum of two (2) full credit classes per quarter for a total of eight (8) credits per year. Middle school students are required to complete one and a half (1.5) classes per quarter for a total of six (6) classes per year.
- 5. Students who are behind in credits will be expected to increase their rate of class completion in order to recoup lost credits. Not meeting these requirements will result in removal from the Cyber Academy, at the discretion of administration. Academic progress will be monitored weekly and progress reports sent via email will be available upon request. Students are required to adhere to each online course's academic expectations and to follow the individual academic progress plan established by the District.
