Ask a parent to read about each stage and act them out.</p> <p>English:</p>	<p>Butterfly Coffee Filters</p> <p>You will need coffee filters, markers, spray bottle or dropper, clothes pin or pipe cleaner</p> <p>~Color the coffee filter with different colored markers</p> <p>~apply water to the coffee filter</p> <p>~Let Coffee filter dry</p> <p>~Draw a face on the clothes pin</p>



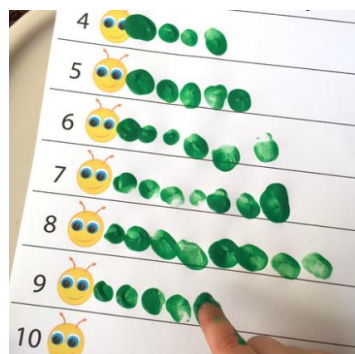
