LEARN TO SKI OR SNOWBOARD! Group will go to Peek n Peak 8 times together on Friday nights in January-February. Eight lessons are included! Beginners and first timers are welcome. This is a great opportunity to learn a life-long fitness activity. If you are able to go up yourself before Dec 24 or after March 1, your once a week passes are good for unlimited skiing and boarding. Any day and any time!

REVIEW THIS BEFORE TURNING IN YOUR APPLICATION!

- * You may buy <u>any type</u> of pass for <u>yourself</u>, <u>family or friends</u> through us to get the **big club discount**. Your pass can be for any type or time but only Collegiate Academy students may ride the ski bus.
- * Not mandatory to pay for or ride the bus but well worth it once weather gets really bad. (\$16 per trip)
- *Club nights: Friday nights beginning January 8th through February 26th
- *Once a Week Ski Pass includes 8 ski lessons;
 - * Mark your application for day and selected time (Friday weekend-once a week pass \$159) if going up with the school
 - * Mark your application ski lesson snowboard lesson or no lesson and select lesson time
- *Equipment can be stored in at bottom of staircase just inside French St. entrance during school on Friday
- *Bus leaves from French Street at 3:30
- *Bus leaves the Peak to return to Academy at 9:30
- *Rides are to be at Academy at 10:00pm on State Street to pick you up
- *If your ride is not there and we have to wait, you do not ride the bus next week.
- *Please ask your rides NOT to park in front of the school on State Street, this is the bus unloading area.
- *If your parents are going to pick you up at the Peak: Students must have a signed note from the parents and show the chaperone this upon boarding the bus before we leave.
- *Ski pass is good for **unlimited use** any day/time before December 23rd and also starting March 1st to the end of the season. From December 24-March 1 the once a week pass is only good on day you have chosen. Ski Pass insurance is available but not required. **You must accept or decline** this on the application.

TRANSFERRING OF BADGES: Ski/Ride passes are non-transferable. Only the person whose name appears on the badge is permitted to use that pass. This is a criminal offense in New York State. Badge privileges will be revoked indefinitely and the resort may choose to prosecute.

LEFT BADGES AT HOME: If a person leaves their badge at home, they will have to purchase lift ticket for the day and rentals if needed.

LOST BADGES: If a person loses their badge, they should stop at the snowsports desk to see if it has been turned in immediately: a replacement fee will be charged.

REVOKED BADGES: Management of the resort reserves the right to revoke any lift passes if the rules of NY State or Peak'n Peak are violated. This means getting caught going off trails may result in losing ski/ride privileges for the season.

PARENTS SHOULD BE AWARE:

If a student gets seriously injured and needs to go to the hospital, parents should be prepared to drive to the Peak to pick their student up. They do not provide ambulance transport to any Erie Hospitals. If they must go to the hospital and can't wait they will be taken to a hospital in New York State. This is obviously worst case scenario but parents should be aware that skiing and snowboarding can be hazardous and parents should be available if something were to occur. We do have a very low occurrence of serious injuries and most can be avoided by following the rules and using common sense on the mountain. Parents are also aware that the student discipline code still applies to students when outside of the school on a school organized trip. Serious violations will be turned directly over to Peek n Peak and the New York State Police.
