

Advanced Placement and Scheduling Dual Enrollment Courses at Gannon University

Students: Please read this important information CAREFULLY if you plan to schedule dual enrollment courses next year:

ENGLISH: Collegiate students who are currently enrolled in an AP English course and plan to take the AP test in that class will have to provide the Gannon Admission Office a copy of the AP score in July when scores are available. **WHEN YOU TAKE THE AP TEST, YOU HAVE AN OPPORTUNITY TO SEND SCORES TO COLLEGES AND IT WILL EXPEDITE THIS PROCESS IF YOU SEND THEM DIRECTLY TO GANNON.** Students who pass the AP Language or Literature test will be scheduled as followed at Gannon:

- AP Language Composition Scores 3-4: exempt from LENG111 College Composition. Student will schedule LENG112 Critical Analysis & Composition
- AP Language Composition Score 5: exempt from LENG111 College Composition & LENG112 Critical Analysis & Composition. Student will be able to schedule an English class at Gannon at the 200 level
- AP Literature & Composition Score 3-4: Student can take a Gannon English class in the Literature Series
- AP Literature & Composition Score 5: Student exempt from LENG111, LENG112, AND Literature Series

MATH: If you are taking AP Calculus (AB or BC) this year and plan to take the AP Calculus test, follow the directions above for providing the AP test score to Gannon. You will schedule Calculus I, with Calculus II as an alternate. Indicate AP in the margin and provide your score in July as soon as you receive it. The fastest way to do this is to send the scores directly when completing the AP bubbling process. Once the score has been received by Gannon, your final course placement will be made.

OTHER SUBJECTS: Your course selection at Gannon must not duplicate coursework completed at Collegiate. For example, if you plant to take Intro to Psychology at Gannon, do not schedule AP Psychology as the content is too similar.

COST: Gannon courses are \$100 per credit. Checks should be made out to Gannon University.

AP WEIGHT: AP credit is awarded only for dual enrollment classes in core subjects. Students are eligible to take other courses, with approval, but might receive honors elective credit.

SCHEDULING: It is suggested that students sign up for dual enrollment classes at 8:00 a.m. or in the fourth block time (1:20 – 3:00 p.m.). While Collegiate schedules will be adjusted for dual enrollment, students most likely will still miss some class time from Collegiate courses. They are responsible for making up any missed work due to dual enrollment.

TRANSPORTATION: Transportation to and from the college is the responsibility of the student.

TRANSFER CREDIT: College credit can enhance a college application, but might or might not be accepted for credit at another college. Students are encouraged to check the transfer of college credit policy on the website of colleges they are interested in applying to.

CANCELLATION: Any student who cancels their dual enrollment course over the summer will be responsible for any required summer assignments for the Collegiate Academy course they take instead. Once the fall semester starts, students are subject to the cancellation policies of the college and permission of the Collegiate Academy administration.

CORE REQUIREMENT: Any dual enrollment course taken to replace a required core class must be taken in the fall semester.

STUDENT BEHAVIOR: Students are required to be in Collegiate Academy dress code and follow Collegiate Academy student expectations of Pride, Honor, Respect. They must sign in at the attendance office upon return to school and attend their Collegiate classes on days when they are not in attendance at the college course. Dual enrollment requires a maturity and integrity of the participating students.

NO AP REQUIREMENT: Students scheduling a dual enrollment course who are not in an AP class in that subject this year will schedule the entry level college course that is subsequent to their Collegiate Academy coursework. For example, a student taking Language Arts 11 in junior year will schedule Gannon LENG111 College Composition for senior year.
