<p>Project Description</p> <p>Edison Elementary, a community school, works with United Way; Lead Partner, Achievement Center; Corporate Partner, GE Transportation; and Community Partner, Boys & Girls Club. The Community Schools model is a strategy for organizing school and community resources around student success. A community school is both a place and a set of partnerships that help address health, wellness and the social needs of its students, families and the surrounding neighborhood.</p> <p>Edison continues to work and improve upon priorities from quarter 1; including BEST, Uniform Pantry, School-Wide Family Events and Expanded Learning Opportunities. 50% of quarter 2's priorities were completed. One priority that was not met will be implemented in week 2 of quarter 3 and the second unmet priority will be addressed within the first 4 weeks of quarter 3.</p> <p>Edison's gratitude for the generosity and kindness during the holiday season is immeasurable. - **Physical Health** of Edison's Pre-K and Kindergarteners is being strengthened by a pilot program with the Sight Center to address visual-motor integration deficits and provide rehabilitation services. Pre-K and Kindergarteners were screened by their teachers and 55 students were flagged for needing an additional assessment. Sight Center, in partnership with Dr. Vilella, evaluated 28 students on 1/12/2018. A second evaluation date will be scheduled. Once evaluations are completed, students identified as at risk will participate in occupational rehabilitation services. The purpose of this evaluation is to eliminate the potential for vision problems and identify the need for occupational therapy services to ensure vision deficits do not impact the student's academic performance.
- During quarter 2, the **Assist-Change Program**, a program teaching various skills to students struggling with behaviors that impede academic performance, was discussed and further developed with the behavioral support team and shared with faculty on 1/8/2018. The first round of students will begin the program on 1/29/2018.
- The **Food Pantry** was established on 10/12/2017 with the first distribution on 10/26/2017. There have been two distributions (11/30/2017 and 12/21/2017) in quarter 2 with the next distribution scheduled for 1/25/2018. 54 families were served in quarter 2. Ongoing totals include 326 people, including: 167 children, 13 elderly, and 146 adults.
- The **Backpack Food Program** last year was based on grade level, which has now changed to a needs based program. Teachers and staff identify students in need and referred to the program. There are currently 38 students receiving bags on Fridays to secure food over the weekend.
- **School-Wide Family Events** take place throughout the school year. During the second quarter, Edison hosted Multicultural Night, Hooked on Books for Kids, WQLN Turn onto Literacy, GE Giving Tree, and Parent Conferences.
- **Expanded Learning Opportunities (STEAM)** have been facilitated through Edison's partnership with GE Transportation. Volunteers from GE worked with fourth grade students on 11/15/2017 relating to light/electricity hands on experiment. Annie Schmitt, teaching artist, finished up her 6 week art program with the 3rd grade during quarter 2.

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Multicultural Night was held on November 16, 2017 and had 44 attendees. There were 29 students and 15 guardians, including 6 volunteers from GE. • Three additional Hooked on Books for Kids visits occurred in quarter 2 (11/10, 12/8, 1/12). Quarter 2's event included 1st-3rd grade respectively. A total of 35 families attended, with 3rd grade parents showing the strongest turnout of 22 families. Each classroom student receives a free book, listens to a guest speaker, and students whose families attend the workshop attend a breakfast and learning session with their families. The number of students, who attended the workshop with their parents were added in student engagement. • WQLN Family Literacy Nights take place on four consecutive Wednesdays in October and November. The first was held on October 25, 2017 and 10 families from grades K-2 attended. Sessions 2-4 were held in quarter on 11/1, 11/8 and 11/15 with 5 parents attending and 8 children per event. • Parent-Teacher conferences were held in November. 248 out of 486 (50%) of parents 	



attended the conferences.

- GE Giving Tree event provided the entire Edison student body and staff with sweatshirts; in addition to a gift giving event held at the Boys and Girls Club on 12/21/2017, where 196 students received gifts and 89 parents attended the event.
- GE STEM event with the 4th grade occurred on 11/15 where 20 students explored Light. An event was scheduled for 1/10 but due to severe inclement weather, the event was postponed.
- Professional development was provided by United Way's Mike Jaruszewicz on 211, Achievement Center's Nicole Wells on Systems of Care, and Achievement Center's Cassie Dundon on self-care.
- Erie Playhouse workshop on Petite Rouge for 2nd, 4th, and 5th grade on 1/18/2018.


