

## Ir- to go

yo	voy	nosotros	vamos
tú	vas	vosotros	vais
él, ella, usted	va	ellos, ellas, ustedes	van

- When using the verb Ir- to go, you always need the preposition “a” after it. Similar to English, in Spanish you go “to” a place.

### Por ejemplo:

- Yo voy a la escuela.
- Marta va al café.

\* a + el = al

\* a + la = a la

  - Está nublado (it's cloudy)
  - Hace calor (it's hot out)

- You must use all forms of the verb voy/vas/va/vamos/vais/van
