SUMO WRESTLING


- (1) Sumo is a sport that **originated** in Japan. This sport is **similar** to wrestling. A Sumo match is won if one wrestler pushes the other out of a circular ring, or if a wrestler touches the ground with any part of their body besides their foot.
- (2) The sport has many traditions. Sumo wrestlers have very strict rules they have to follow. These rules come from centuries of tradition. Sumo wrestlers live in a **communal** house; they are required to live in the house together to make sure they follow the rules. Some of the rules they have to follow include: growing their hair and wearing it in a bun, wearing certain clothes, and eating certain foods. Their life is very **regimented** from the time they wake up until the time they go to bed. If a Sumo wrestler breaks a rule, they can get fined or suspended from the sport. The person in charge of the wrestlers, known as the stablemaster, can also get in trouble if a wrestler breaks a rule.
- (3) Wrestlers who are better or who have more **seniority** get to be more comfortable than the junior wrestlers. The lowest ranking wrestlers only get to wear a thin cotton robe and wooden sandals, even in the winter. Junior wrestlers have to get up early in the morning to train and do chores. They cook, clean, and even hold towels for the higher-ranking men. Higher-ranking wrestlers get to wear silk robes. Senior wrestlers also get to shower first and eat first. Life is hard for newly **recruited** wrestlers. They often get the worst jobs and have to serve the higher-ranking men. Many new recruits drop out of Sumo wrestling.
- (4) Sumo wrestlers have a routine for eating and sleeping. After they wake up, they do not eat breakfast. They train until lunch, which is their first meal of the day. They eat traditional food of stew cooked with meat, fish, and vegetables served with rice. After their large lunch, they take a siesta, or nap. The nap after lunch helps the Sumo wrestlers gain weight. After the nap, the junior wrestlers train more, go to school, and do chores. Senior Sumo wrestlers get to relax or write letters to their fans.
- (5) The diet and lifestyle of Sumo wrestlers can be very **detrimental** for their health. Sumo wrestlers drink a lot of alcohol and work hard to gain weight. Many wrestlers get diabetes or liver disease. A Sumo wrestler has a shorter **life expectancy** than an average Japanese man. The life expectancy of the wrestler is between 60 and 65, which is 10 years less than an average man from Japan.




